<b>To prevent crime and disorder</b>	Yes	<p>An application has been submitted by Tatjana Jerjomcenko for a new premises licence for the premises named as SMAK, to sell alcohol. The premises currently trades as an Eastern European delicatessen.</p> <p><b>The proposal times to sell alcohol is:</b></p> <p><b>Monday 11:00 - 20:00</b>  <b>Tuesday 11:00 - 20:00</b>  <b>Wednesday 11:00 - 20:00</b>  <b>Thursday 11:00 - 20:00</b>  <b>Friday 11:00 - 20:00</b>  <b>Saturday 11:00 - 20:00</b>  <b>Sunday 11:00 - 18:00</b></p> <p>Should an alcohol licence be granted, the police have already agreed in advance with the applicant and their licensing legal consultant, the above hours and below conditions.</p> <p><b>These conditions are:</b></p> <p><b>CCTV</b>  <b>Beer, cider, lager over 5.5%</b>  <b>Refusals log</b>  <b>Challenge 25</b>  <b>No alcoholic miniatures or quarter bottles of spirits permitted</b>  <b>Training for staff in sales of alcohol and CCTV</b>  <b>No single cans – to be sold in packs of 4 and above</b>  <b>Sealed cans and bottles and not to be consumed on the premises.</b>  <b>Off- licence sales only.</b></p>

	<p>The police objection to the application is on the basis that the premises (not Tatjana Jerjomcenko ) is currently under investigation with Trading Standards.</p> <p>We would want any license holder and any person associating themselves with these premises to be acting responsibly to prevent any form of crime and disorder and therefore whilst there are on- going current criminal investigations taking place I do not feel the premises suited to an alcohol licence</p> <p>In summary we feel if this were to be granted it would be detrimental to policing in Watford and the community.</p> <p>This application raises concerns of how an alcohol license would impact the wider community in terms of crime and crime prevention.</p> <p>The Constabulary have concerns regarding this application and accordingly on behalf of the Chief Constable I represent against it.</p>
