3.0 BACKGROUND

3.1 At the meeting of the Task Group on 31 January 2013 the Task Group considered scrutiny suggestions by Members for the Community Safety Partnership Task Group. One of the suggestions, made by Councillor Meerabux, related to how community groups engaged on community safety issues.
