Report of the District Manager

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 The purpose of this report is to advise members of the current status of petitions, to advise members of any objections to traffic regulation orders and to inform the Panel of any other local issues of importance.

2. PETITIONS RECEIVED

2.1 No new petitions have been received.

3. PETITIONS UPDATE

Petition – St. James Road One-Way

- 3.1 In Oct 2011 a petition was received from the residents of St James Road in the Vicarage Ward. The petition contained signatures from 112 residents who are requesting their road is made into a "one-way" street.
- 3.2 At the October 2011 Panel, members agreed to fund a survey of vehicle movements from Discretionary Budget, so that current levels of usage and direction of traffic flow can be established.
- 3.3 The survey was carried out in December 2011, and results will be made available to the Local Member and Lead petitioner as soon as the results are analysed, and reported to the March 2012 Panel meeting.

4. OBJECTIONS TO TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDERS

WATFORD SPECIALIST MARKET REPORT – CONSIDERATION OF OBJECTIONS TO THE PROPOSED TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER – HIGH STREET, THE PARADE, WATFORD

4.1 Members agreed at the October 2011 Panel meeting to support overruling the two objections to the proposed Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) (Prohibition of Driving and Cycling on Market Days) associated with the

holding of 'specialist' markets on that specified area of High Street, The Parade.

4.2 The Order is ready for sealing, and Members will be advised of the date when the order comes into effect.

5. LOCAL ISSUES – Woodmere Avenue Width Restriction Scheme

- 5.1 This scheme, to strengthen the existing width restriction, was constructed with funds from the 2010/11 Discretionary Budget.
- 5.2 Since the scheme was open to traffic on 28th February 2011, a number of vehicles have collided with the restriction, resulting in a number of complaints, and sustained media interest.
- 5.3 Over the period October to December 2011 there have been three further complaints 1 in October and two in November and no further insurance claims. One claimant took the county to court in December and lost their case the county was found not to be at fault.

6. LOCAL ISSUES – Radlett Road / Eastfield Avenue Thames Water Flood Alleviation Scheme

- 6.1 A further meeting with highway officers and Thames Water engineers took place in November 2011. Thames Water confirmed any major scheme to increase storage and alleviate flooding in this area is not a short term priority as too few residents have reported flood water inundating their living space, which is the criteria for allocating funds.
- 6.2 Thames Water have advised residents to report to them any incidences of living space being flooded, so they are able to prioritise their funds to the areas most in need.
- 6.3 Thames Water are happy to provide residents with advice on self-help measures to protect their property. It is understood affected residents in this area are already following this line of enquiry.

TO CONSIDER THE USE OF WATFORD'S BUS LANES BY HACKNEY CARRIAGES

Report of the Network Manager

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 To seek the panels views on allowing taxis (hackney carriages) to use the bus lanes in Watford.
- 1.2 Views from the panel will be fed into the forthcoming Highways and Transport Panel for consideration.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 In April 2011, HCC received a letter from the Chair of Watford Hackney Carriage Drivers Association requesting that consideration be given to allowing taxis to use specific sections of the bus lanes in Watford.
- 2.2 Three sites initially highlighted by the Association:
 - 1. Lower High Street/High Street/A411 Exchange Road junction 'No Entry' to High Street from Lower High Street, except buses. (This is not a bus lane, but has a bus only restriction)
 - 2. Station Road bus lane between Watford Junction and St Albans Road.
 - 3. St Albans Road bus lane between Bedford Street and Station Road
- 2.3 Following the request in April 2011, the Chair of the Association and South West Herts Network Management team met to discuss the issues in more detail and to investigate the options. The main reason cited by the association for allowing taxis to use bus lanes was:
 - 'We have huge problems with congestion and fare disputes with passengers who are demanding that we should be able to use the bus lanes. On frequent occasions passengers are jumping out of Taxis without paying. This is a big problem and causing so much grief for drivers concerned.'
- 2.4 The request only applies to licensed hackney carriages. It is not suggested to include private hire vehicles in this proposal.
- 2.5 There are 289 hackney carriages registered by Watford Borough Council.

- 2.6 The Watford Hackney Carriage Drivers Association estimates that 40% of Watford's registered taxis work during the day. The remaining 60% work during the night. A typical night shift is 6pm 2am (6pm 4am on Fridays and Saturdays).
- 2.7 The Association reports they experience loss of trade particularly during peak times, as taxis are forced to wait in queues with other traffic.
- 2.8 The Association suggest that if they were allowed to use Watford's bus lanes, they could bypass congestion at key points in Watford to improve travel times, reduce fares and generally make travelling by taxi more attractive.
- 2.9 Improved travel times would improve the turnover of journeys and increase the number of fares that a taxi could potentially take during the shift.
- 2.10 Section 3.26 of LTP3 Volume 2 (Policy Document) refers to taxis and states:

Taxis form an important part of the integrated passenger transport network. They have a role to play in reducing dependency on the private car by providing a final leg in rail or bus journeys, and by providing an alternative to walking and cycling in inclement weather.

3.0 Traffic Surveys

- 3.1 Traffic surveys were carried out counting the numbers of taxis and buses during peak times at the locations below;
 - Lower High Street/Exchange Road/High Street;
 - 2. Station Road (near St Albans Road);
 - 3. St Albans Road (near Station Road);
- 3.2 The full results of the traffic surveys are shown below:

4.0 Impacts

- 4.1 Traffic surveys of buses and taxis carried at the three sites showed varying levels of bus and taxi use.
- 4.2 Allowing taxis to use bus lanes will have some impact on buses, although the traffic surveys suggest this should not be significant.
- 4.3 Allowing taxis to use bus lanes would slightly reduce the number of vehicles using multi vehicle lanes, which may prove of some benefit to traffic. However, any changes to signal timings such as increased 'green time' to accommodate taxis through junctions is likely to have a negative effect on all traffic.

5.0 Options

5.1 Would the panel:

i. Prefer to retain the current position and only allow buses and pedal cycles to use bus lanes in Watford;

or

ii. Prefer to allow taxis (hackney carriages) to use some or all bus lanes and 'bus only' junctions in Watford;

SECTION 106 DEVELOPER (S106) CONTRIBUTIONS

Report of the Area Highway Development Control Manager

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report advises the Panel of schemes which are funded by S106 contributions held by HCC. It lists new contributions received by HCC to allow members to suggest possible uses.

2. SCHEMES FUNDED BY EXISTING S106 CONTRIBUTIONS

- 2.1 The schemes for which existing S106 contributions have been approved can be found in Appendix A.
- 2.2 JMP members will be aware that the DfT announced 10 days before Christmas that funding will be made available for the Croxley Rail Link (CRL). In a press release on 14 December they committed to provide a contribution of £76.2m towards the total cost of £115.9m. Members of the JMP have been informed previously that planning obligations held by HCC in the borough, in Three Rivers and in Bushey will part-fund the difference. These are identified in the Traffic Light Report (appendix B) by the rail link being shown in capital letters in the Possible Schemes column.
- 2.3 Members in Watford expressed concern at the reduction in funding for more local schemes and measures that this would cause. As a result an agreement was reached with the Executive Member for Highways & Transport in July whereby £250,000 would be released for use in this way. These will be selected by the Officer Steering Group operating to the HCC 106 Protocol informed by the views of members fed into it by the District Manager.
- 2.4 The first possible such local 'releases' of funds earmarked for the major rail scheme discussed at the Officer Steering Group meeting on 9 December included use of funds currently earmarked for the CRL to continue the implementation of Real Time Passenger Information at bus stops across the borough from money previously allocated to the CRL from the Leggatts Campus development.
- 2.5 The JMP has supported investigation into improvements on North Western Avenue. An exception report has been submitted to the Strategic Transport Infrastructure Board on behalf of the District Manager requesting access to £62,500 of s106 funding in 2012/13 to be put towards the design and implementation of the local safety scheme for which a feasibility study has been completed. Provided that this is successful it was agreed at the S106 Annual Programme Setting Meeting

- (APSM) on 5 January that this should be funded from money previously allocated to the CRL from the Leggatts Campus development.
- 2.6 Members have indicated their support for the provision of a pedestrian crossing on Courtlands Drive. This too was felt by the APSM to be an appropriate use of funds derived from the Leggatts Campus development.
- 2.7 The County Council is working with the Borough and businesses on the Croxley and Watford business parks. Ongoing support for the W30 bus service is key to this joined-up working. Funding in 2013/14 was therefore agreed by the APSM from funds ring-fenced for CRL. The County Council will be working with stakeholders to seek to replicate the equivalent match funding made available for 2012/13 by the Croxley Business Park.
- 2.8 The APSM agreed to fund work to promote pedestrian accessibility in the town centre area from CRL funds by allocating money to improvement of the The Avenue subway and routes connecting to Cassiobury Park.
- 2.9 The reallocation of funds previously earmarked for the Rail Link is set out in appendix B. Members will note that the estimates given come to a total of a little over £250,000. The excess will be offset by new planning obligations collected by the County Council, the first of which are identified in the appendix.
- 2.10 These changes in proposed use are shown in the full Traffic Light Report for the borough which is attached as appendix C. Members will note a number of new possible uses added by the Officer Steering Group. Attention is drawn particularly to developments in the vicinity of the Dome Roundabout which are now shown as contributing towards a holistic study of traffic, safety and movement issues around the roundabout and at the Cow Lane junction to the north of it.





JMP DISCRETIONARY BUDGET AND LOCAL WORKS PROGRAMME

Report of the Lead Assistant District Manager

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report provides information about local works programmes that are client managed by the Herts Highways Watford area team. This includes the Discretionary budget, approved section 106 funds for local schemes and the Super CAT2 maintenance budget. The report also provides an update on the local schemes as part of the forthcoming Highway Locality Budget for the 2012/13 year.

2. DISCRETIONARY BUDGET PROGRAMME

Discretionary Programme 2011/12

- 2.1 The list of suggested works for 2011/2012 year is contained in Appendix B. The list contains new suggestions put forward by members, plus schemes continuing and progressing from the previous year.
- 2.2 Scheme number 1 is a proposed scheme to improve the grass area outside 196–200 Leggatts Rise. Following a meeting in May with the County Member it has been proposed to upgrade the existing area of damaged verge with grass-crete blocks for vehicles and to install post and rail fencing to prevent vehicles overriding other areas of the verge. Members agreed to place the scheme on hold during 2010/11 and reconsider the proposals in 2011-12. Estimated cost is £13,000, of which the local member has agreed to fund £1000 from his locality budget. Works completed.
- 2.3 Scheme 2 is Phase 2 of the streetscape proposals in Buckingham Road which comprises construction of block paving. Estimated cost is £ 7,500. Works completed.
- 2.4 Scheme 3 is the Environmental Deep Cleaning Project jointly undertaken with the Borough Council comprising of 26 roads, of which eight are in the Sandringham Road area, four in the Watford Fields Area, seven in the West Watford area, and seven in the Nascot area. Estimated costs from the Discretionary budget are £25,000, topped up with £17,000 from CAT2 budget. Works completed with exception of some patching in Liverpool Road which is scheduled for first quarter of 2012.

- 2.5 Scheme 4 is for completion of the schemes for Zones 2 (Smith Street area inside ring road) and Zone 3 (Elfrida Road area) of the 20mph Limits. Provision has been made for £200 of design fees to complete post site work activities.
- 2.6 Scheme 5 is for completion of the Francis Road and Percy Road one-way scheme / 20 mph limit scheme. Provision has been made for £800 of design fees to complete post site work activities. "After" speed counts show 85percentile speeds are below 24mph, so both roads are suitable for 20mph limits. The local member has requested Market Street is brought into the 20 mph limit area speed survey to confirm if this is possible are ready to be ordered subject to Panel Agreement to £1000 additional expenditure for survey, consultation and TRO process.
- 2.7 Scheme 6 is Fairview Drive No Entry scheme. Site works are completed, apart from minor snagging works. Early observations show residents are coping with and complying with new layout.
- 2.8 Scheme 7 is Dell Road and Elm Grove Traffic Management scheme.

 The Feasibility study is completed and informal consultation is underway on the recommended option.
- 2.9 Scheme 8 is the 20mph Zone scheme for Cecil Street / Judge Street area. This is being funded as an IWP scheme under the speed management strategy. The feasibility study is now complete. Details of progress can be read in the IWP Progress Report, which is Item 9 Appendix C of the Agenda.
- 2.10 Scheme 9 is the A41 North Western Avenue VA signs. Details of the scheme are included as Appendix I. Fixed warning signs were installed in May. The speed and volume counts, repeated in Oct 2011, revealed speeds have not fallen. Hence S106 funding has been secured for design and installation of VA warning signs and coloured surfacing during 2012 which has been ordered, and expected to be installed in first quarter of 2012/13.
- 2.11 Scheme 10 is for DDA compliant dropped kerbs for a disabled resident in Ebury Road to facilitate use of electric buggy. Works Cost estimated at £1300. Works completed.
- 2.12 Scheme 11 is for DDA compliant dropped kerbs for several locations in Chesham Way and Croxley View. Estimated works costs are £1500. Works completed.
- 2.13 Scheme 12 is for DDA compliant dropped kerbs at the Windsor Road / Sandringham Road junction. Estimated works costs are £1500. To be carried out during Deep Clean programme during Oct. Completed.
- 2.14 Scheme 13 is for construction of 3 to 4 parking bays outside Nos. 287/289 Sheepcote Lane. Estimated works costs are £8000. Job

- cancelled. replaced with Scheme 21. Abortive costs need to be found as contractor had already received delivery of "grasscrete" materials these have been kept to a minimum as the materials have been sold on to another contractor.
- 2.15 Scheme 14 is for lighting enhancement of 18 No. footway luminaires between Water Lane and Shaftesbury Road (Phase 1 Estimated works cost £5400) has been installed. Phase 2, comprising 9 No. footway luminaires in the Reed Walk / Trinity Hall Close areas, estimated at £4700, including cost of Temporary TRO for footpath closures, is scheduled for February.
- 2.16 Scheme 15, promoted by Watford Borough, is for traffic and parking management measures in Greenbank Road in the vicinity of Holyrood School. The proposals comprise mainly waiting restrictions and school keep clear yellow markings, and it is also intended to convert the bus layby into a bus boarder. Estimated costs are £20000 works and £2500 design fees to cover safety auditing, design checks and health and safety risk assessment obligations under the Construction Design and Management Regulations. A meeting of key stakeholders agreed that consultation processes for the waiting restrictions and school keep clear yellow markings should be done before the bus boarder works. A scheme agreed by Safety Auditors and key stakeholders is currently out to consultation.
- 2.17 Scheme 16 is a safety or traffic calming scheme on Old North Western Avenue to reduce the impact of a substantial number of damage only accidents occurring on the bend near the junction with Courtlands Drive. The District Manager commissioned a feasibility study from his discretionary budget. Member and resident consultation has revealed a preference for a local traffic calming scheme. The District Manager has submitted a CS99 application for S106 funds from the Leggatts Campus development which has been sanctioned by the Officer Steering Group. Final approval for S106 funds takes place in the first quarter of 2012. Whilst awaiting funds for the traffic calming scheme, the Oct 2011 Panel agreed to allocated £3200 of Discretionary funding to install Treiff kerbing in place of the post and rail fence to prevent reoccurance of the property damage (Scheme 17). This has now been installed.
- 2.18 Scheme 18 is the pedestrian enhancements for the footway on Orphanage Road and Radlett Road under the railway bridges. An application for S106 funding has been made for the estimated works costs of £5000, which has been successful. Works are planned for March.
- 2.19 Scheme 19 is the drainage investigations to reduce flooding and increase capacity of drainage network on Orphanage Road under the railway bridge. Estimate for these works is £20,000. Works were completed during October half term. The measures have been

- successful in preventing reoccurrence of the flooding during recent heavy rainfall events in January.
- 2.20 The current estimate of fees and works costs totals £100,170 which is above the current confirmed budget of £100,000.
- 2.21 Members are asked to consider all the technical advice and reports provided and confirm a programme to the Lead Assistant District Manager.

3. SUPER CAT 2 WORK PROGRAMME – 2011/12

- 3.1 The Super CAT2 budget is an enhanced CAT2 budget used to support local highway maintenance initiatives and includes larger areas of work which fit in between the minor CAT 2 operational maintenance works and the larger scale IWP maintenance work programmes. Consideration has been given to maintenance issues in developing this work programme and the need to accord with the overall asset management principles of Herts Highways but with a degree of local flexibility and judgement.
- 3.2 Appendix C outlines the suggested Super Cat2 programme for 2011-12. Officers have identified 13 schemes across the Borough. These comprise carriageway surfacing works in Stratford Road, Whippendell Road, Church Road, Franklin Road, Greenbank Road, Wimbourne Grove, Chapel Close, Holland Gardens, Spring Gardens, Butterwick, footway surfacing works in Telford Close, and Structural Maintenance works to structures in Coates Way and Chalk Hill.
- 3.3 Please note the number of schemes which can be delivered is subject to available budgets. The costs estimates from the Works Team have come in below the budget allocated, so this has enabled another 4 suggested schemes to be added, which are footway surfacing schemes in Cuffley Avenue, Lansdown Close and Dell Road, and carriageway surfacing works in Windsor Road.
- 3.4 The footway scheme on Telford Close and carriageway surfacing schemes on Stratford Road, Whippendell Road, Church Road, Franklin Road, Greenbank Road, Wimbourne Grove, Chapel Close, Holland Gardens, Spring Gardens, Butterwick, and the retaining wall maintenance scheme in Coates Way, are now complete.
- 3.5 The Lead Assistant District Manager will be able to answer any queries regarding the programme.

4. HIGHWAYS LOCALITY BUDGET Phase 1 Schemes 2012/13

4.1 The list of schemes chosen for quotation for Phase 1 schemes i.e. medium sized footway and carriageway schemes is shown in Appendix D

5. HIGHWAYS LOCALITY BUDGET 2012/13 – cross Watford issues

- 5.1 Lining. We consider it would be best if each member batched their own work enabling us to charge correctly to their own budgets.
- 5.2 Probationers. We would recommend that each member puts £1666 into the fund that WBC matches for works by the probationers three days per week throughout the Borough.

6. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 6.1 That members confirm a Discretionary programme of works for 2011/12.
- 6.2 That members agree an HLB programme of works for 2012/13.



ITEM08 – APPENDIX I

North Western Avenue (Stanborough / Leggatts) - Proposed VA signs to address speeding

- Cllr Giles-Medhurst has requested that consideration be given to measures to address speeding in North Western Avenue. This is relative to the existing 40mph speed limit which is an appropriate speed limit for this road. The main area of concern is near the West Drive junction where pedestrians cross the road to use the steps and footpath giving access to Berry Avenue. There is a cluster of 3 accidents in this area (most recent 3 year period of statistics) although none involved pedestrians.
- A feasibility study has revealed that a warning type VA sign may not be supported until a fixed warning sign solution has been tried, as this is one of the criteria from the Speed Management Strategy.
- At the July panel, it was agreed to add in additional measures (red coloured surfacing where vehicles were overrunning the existing hatching where two lanes converge into one, and put more emphasis on the speeding issue, plus apply for S106 funds.
- A S106 application has been made for two VA signs which will have the message 'SLOW DOWN' in addition to the pedestrian warning sign, plus the red coloured surfacing. Officers Steering Group have accepted the application, but £15k maintenance may need to be found from discretionary funds as a fixed sign solution has not first been tried.
- To avoid the maintenance payment, fixed warning signs should be progressed at the earliest opportunity. These have been ordered.

Item 09 Appendix D - UPDATE ON WATFORD JUNCTION--NATIONAL STATION IMPROVEMENT PROJECT (NSIP)

Progress Update provided by Andy Gipson, consultant to HCC Passenger Transport Unit

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

In view of the importance of this scheme regular updates will now be provided to Members at Panel meetings. Since the last Panel meeting on 27^h October, 2011 the current status of NSIP at Watford Junction is as follows:-

2. STATUS OF NSIP

2.1 Drop Off Facility

London Midland (LM) propose to install 10 marked bays in the long-stay car park near to the entrance to platforms 9 and 10. This will be used by season ticket holders and disabled passengers. Signage indicating this facility will be included in the schedule of new signs to be provided for the short-stay car park in Woodford Road (See 2.2 below). LM have indicated that the bays will reduce the total number of spaces in the existing car park and affect a number of existing disabled parking bays. This would require a station change procedure because of current railway legislation and an exemption to current standards may be required from the Department for Transport. If this happens some delay is inevitable, however HCC officers have repeated the decision of Panel Members that the drop off facility must be provided as part of the NSIP scheme at Watford Junction.

An investigation into an alternative egress for private cars onto St. Albans Road has commenced and is now subject to preliminary and full design work being undertaken by Hertfordshire Highways. If these proposals are affordable and can be agreed with London Midland and Network Rail, implementation will be sought before the end of 2012/13. Progress has been good with both LM and Network Rail and discussions with the land owners of Penn Road are expected to be held before the end of February, 2012.

The installation of automatic gates and a ticket vending machine at the entrance to platforms 9 and 10 with CCTV controls are subject to review by LM. LM is looking at ways of securing a funding contribution for the work from the Department for Transport.

2.2 Woodford Road

Network Rail made the Planning Application for the short-stay car park in Woodford Road on 7th March and approval was made by Watford Borough

Council on 10th May, 2011.

The lease agreement between Hertfordshire County Council and Network Rail has been agreed, however Network Rail have still to legally sign off the document.

LM will install a ticket machine for the enforcement of the 20 minute time to park; no charges will be made.

LM will install a real time train arrivals/departures display for car park users. The proposal to review the bus stand and provide pay and display waiting in Woodford Road for approximately 9 vehicles has been approved in principle by Watford B.C., Hertfordshire Police and the bus operator affected Arriva.

Hertfordshire Highways have completed consultation on the proposal which requires a Traffic Regulation Order. Panel Members should note that the majority of responses from residents in Woodford Road requested resident parking bays rather than pay and display waiting.

The TRO is expected to be formally advertised on 20th January, 2012. This proposal will be jointly funded between HCC and Watford B.C. and subject to the TRO being made would be implemented when the bus station work is completed in July, 2012. It will not be possible to reduce the bus stand capacity in Woodford Road whilst work in the bus station area is being undertaken.

2.3 Public Information

LM plan to post information at the station and on their website londonmidland.com during February 2012. Further consultation will be undertaken with major stakeholders such as taxi operators and groups representing the disabled. Additional information relating to bus stop allocations and services will be provided by HCC as part of the Intalink service.

Members will be provided with this information in advance of the general public.

2.4 Bus Drivers Mess Room

LM has agreed to provide this facility for bus drivers. Currently a parked bus is used by Arriva staff. A licence agreement to agree the level and maintenance of the facility is required between LM and Arriva. Discussions on this agreement and the costs involved continue.

2.5 Platform 11 (Abbey Line)

The installation and associated costs of the heated waiting room for Platform11 has been agreed. The build and installation of the waiting room is expected before the end of March, 2012.

2.6 Programme

The main contractor has been appointed by LM and will be J. Murphy & Sons of Cannock, Staffordshire.

The funding for J. Murphy to commence work is held by Network Rail and is expected to be received and approved by London Midland by 29th February, 2012.

On the basis of this date being met the timing of the works on-site are as follows:-

April 2012--Start October 2012--Finish

HCC officers have indicated to Network Rail and London Midland that in view of the importance of the scheme and the funding contribution that HCC has made, these programme times should be brought forward by at least one month to avoid further delay. Discussions will therefore continue with Network Rail and London Midland to see if this can be resolved.

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3. FURTHER INFORMATION

If further information becomes available from London Midland this will be reported orally at the meeting.

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APPENDIX E - WATFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL HIGHWAY WORKS

<u>Transportation and Infrastructure -- Update</u>

New Time-Tables for the Bus Shelters and QR codes

Over 100 new bus shelter time-tables have been installed at our shelters around the Town. In addition to the bus information and an updated shelter location map the new posters will also include four QR codes (quick response bar codes) for visitors and travellers to use.

The QR codes will enable you to link, via a smart phone, to the Councils web site and then directly to a map showing the available cycle route within the Town.

Should your journey be outside of Watford then there is also a useful QR code for the Interlink web site which provides travel information across Hertfordshire.

For the business visitor to the Town we have a Watford Commuter QR code which provides useful travel advice and finally a QR code for Watford For You web site which provides information on living, visiting and business in Watford.

New Cycle Racks for the Parade

Six new cycle racks have been installed in The Parade, between the Library and Horns Public House to help with the increasing demand for cycle parking in this area. The six Sheffield Hoops will provide cycle parking for up to twelve cycles at any one time.

Way Marking Strategy

As part of the Cultural Strategy for the town centre, works have started on developing a new way marking strategy for the town. The aim will be to provide map based key destination legible signage to ensure that the town is more navigable and core features and landmarks are plotted. As part of the first phase of the project a stakeholders group will be set up to look at developing the project and to look at key design aspects such as the colour theme, font etc.

New Style Street Name Plates

Following the introduction of the new style street name plates as part phase 1 of the County Council led Clarendon Road Pedestrian Improvements Programme, a further 20 name plates with destination sub-plates are to be introduced. The aim will be to expand the new style name plates project to other roads around the town centre and provide pedestrians with the average walking time to key destinations.

Parking Service -- Update

New Parking Machine Project

The new parking machine upgrade project has been completed with the final 12 machines installed last month. The new machines will cater for the new style 5p and 10p coins which are being introduced in March/April. They will also provide added security and user reliability.

The parking service have been working towards producing new GIS (Geographic Information Systems) maps which will be available to the public on-line. The maps will show where 1, 2 and 4hour pay and display parking are located in the Borough and the boundaries of the Controlled Parking Zones.

Traffic Regulation Orders -- Update

Cassiobury Controlled Parking Zone Review

Statutory consultation on the Traffic Orders supporting the expansion of the current zone to include an additional 8 roads, including the holding of a one day exhibition, took place during November and early December 2011. Consideration of the objections is underway. Implementation of this expansion, assuming objections can be resolved satisfactorily is anticipated towards the end of February 2012. Representations from residents of roads on the Cassiobury Estate still outside the zone are now being received requesting inclusion and consideration of these requests will also take place early in 2012.

The Council has started an informal consultation on proposals to manage parking in the vicinity of the shops at the Langley Way/ Cassiobury Drive junction. Improvements to the facilities for pedestrians at this junction are also being developed with a view to bringing forward a more detailed proposal for wider consultation later in 2012.

Nascot Area

Initial proposals for 'commuter ban ' restrictions in Bellamy Close, Grandfield Ave, Langwood Gardens and Maple Grove were the subject of a consultation exercise with residents. A large number of responses were received and the schemes are being revised in light of these comments. Formal Statutory Consultation on a revised scheme is proposed for early 2012.

Further consultation on parking and other traffic related issues in The Avenue, Church Road area and Park Road is planned for later in 2012.

Oxhey Ward parking Consultation

A Ward wide consultation with residents and businesses in relation to parking issues took place during July and August indicated that residents did not support area wide parking controls to address parking issues. Measures to adjust existing yellow line restrictions at junctions within the Ward, including the introduction of some short stay parking to support local shops and some new parking controls on junctions where obstructive parking has been a problem are being developed. The Council is also working closely with OVEG

to support the development of a community led Considerate Parking Scheme aimed at encouraging responsible parking attitudes within the Ward.

Queens Road/ The Broadway

Proposals to introduce a small number of free limited waiting spaces in Queens Road to support top up shopping habits are to be taken to Statutory Consultation during the early part of 2012. Changes to parking controls in Queens Road to extend the length of time motorcycles can be parked free of charge in the designated motorcycle bay is also to be increased from 1 hour to 2 hours.

Shaftesbury Road – Waterfields Recreation Ground car park

Proposals to manage the car park at the end of Shaftesbury Road to protect parking opportunity for residents permit holders and short term visitors to Waterfields Recreation Ground are also due to go to Statutory Consultation early in 2012. Subject to satisfactory resolution of any objections received the target date for implementing changes at this location and also in Queens Road is mid 2012.

Horseshoe Lane and Eastbury Road

New yellow lines in Eastbury Road, Oxhey and Horseshoe Lane Garston were implemented in November 2011.

Various Road Traffic Orders

A Traffic Order to introduce new or extended controls in the following roads has been made and came in to affect on 12 December 2011. At the time of writing this report contractors erecting the requisite signs and laying the lines were still on-site completing the work. It is anticipated that this work will be fully complete by the end of December 2011.

Beechwood Rise
Bushey Mill Lane (Tudor Parade) – disabled bay
Courtlands Drive (Goodwood Parade) – disabled bay
Lavinia Close
Longspring/ Thrums
Tolpits Lane service road

Work on the next 'various roads' Order covering between 15 and 20 sites across the Borough commenced in December. Ward/ Divisional Members will be contacted with initial proposals early in 2012 for their initial comments. It is anticipated that it will take up to the end of the summer 2012 to complete this Order.

Under s115 of the Highways Act

The Borough Council can undertake works on the highway where they are providing an amenity.

A) Highway related

1) Cassiobury Park

Improvements to cycle and pedestrian route signage from existing walking and cycle routes. Sign design options under consideration in conjunction with the HLF bid. Implementation mid2011.

2) Town Centre Cultural Study – Rickmansworth Rd to Albert Rd Sth

The Council has appointed Building Design Partnership (BDP) to provide consultancy services for the feasibility, design and supervision of the public realm works. This element will develop the concept design in the Town Centre Cultural Study for public consultation in Spring 2012. Site surveys are currently underway. In December BDP began a 'factfinding' exercise with the public, officers and organisations to collect views on what should go in the space. This exercise will continue throughout January and includes a meeting with Borough and County members on January 31st at Watford Town Hall. Design options will be produced during Spring for consultation early in the Summer.

3) Gade Access Road - removal of planter D

Works to remove the redundant planter at the side of Gade House are complete. A new loading bay has been created primarily to assist the setting up of the events markets.

B) Transport related projects on Council owned land

1) Woodside Leisure Centre

a) A WBC 106/capital funded project for pedestrian and cycle access improvements to and across the site. Construction and lighting works were completed Dec 2011. A signage review is underway and will be implemented by the end of March 12. The existing TRO to control parking on the site will be modified by the end of March 12 to incorporate the top car park.

2) Oxhey Park pedestrian and cycle bridge

a) Following completion of the bridge additional works to upgrade the path and install direction signage on part of fp56 and the permissive path from the bridge to Lower High St are currently underway

3) Whippendell Woods Bridleway conversion

a) The existing Council owned permissive horse track has been upgraded to adoptable standard and access improvements made at the Rousebarn Lane and Grove Mill Lane entrances. HCC are in the process of finalising legal orders to adopt it as a Bridleway thus permitting cycling on it. HCC have not given an expected completion date.

C) RIGHTS OF WAY WORKS BY THE LOCAL PLANNING AUTHORITY

The Council is required to carry out footpath diversions under the s.257 Town and County Planning Act 1990 to enable developments to take place.

1) Watford Springs site FP50 and 52

Planning consent was granted in August 2009 and the development necessitates the diversion of definitive footpaths 50 and 52. Preparation of draft legal orders is being completed by HCC Rights of Way unit. It is anticipated that they will be published for consultation in Feb 2012. A temporary diversion for the duration of the works will be in place for the duration of construction works.

A Creation Order under s.25 for the dedication of an additional width of path leading to Watford Fields infant school will also be made by Watford Council.

2) Oxhey Park Bridge FP56

The siting of the bridge necessitates the permanent diversion of 60m of definitive footpath on the east bank of the river. Informal consultation has taken place with The Ramblers Association and draft legal orders are expected to be published in Mar 2012 (subject to HCC rights of way approval).
