Most of the works will take place at weekends. There will be an overarching theme of 'Watford's Culture.' Design work will be completed by the end of the current financial year. The vinyl will be applied early in 2012 / 2013. We intend to use the same company that provided the enhancements on the Town Hall subway earlier this year. Map Based Signs: Delivery of two new map based signs will now be implemented early in 2012/2013. One of the signs will be located outside of the entrance to Junction Station and installed as part of the NSIP works. The second sign will be installed at the Clarendon Road / High Street junction. The theme of the signage will fit in with Watford Borough Council's emerging town centre signage strategy. These will be similar to those found on the 'Legible London' website.

2) Alexandra Road Area (IT 12035):

a) Scheme Summary:

Alexandra Road, Denmark Street, Nascot Street, Essex Road & Malden Road

- A 20mph zone encompassing the road listed above.
- This will be lines and signs only in all roads except in Alexandra Road which will require 4 flat top humps.
- The study has also identified the option of considering Stamford Street and Nascot Road as a 20mph zone between Langley Road and Park Road. Speed checks undertaken show that 3 flat top humps would be required in Nascot Road

b) Update:

- 42 responses were received to the consultation with a 51% scheme support.
- Due to the fact that there is no out right support for the scheme from the public and local members have voiced concerns about the physical features required – this project will not proceed.

3) Park Avenue (ITP 12066): a) Scheme Summary:
