Title: North Watford Cemetery Expansion

1.0 Summary

1.1 After a review was carried out of the cemetery service in 2015, a 10 year cemetery strategy was adopted in 2016, which looked at a range of issues, covering all aspects of the service. One critical issue was the capacity of North Watford Cemetery, with 7-9 years remaining at that time, based on burial rates and population growth.

1.2 This report summarises a proposal to expand the existing North Watford Cemetery site within the boundaries of the existing cemetery, based on unused land, currently ornamental landscape as well as options to pursue further provision outside of the Borough with neighbouring authorities. In the current Covid-19 pandemic, burial rates have increased, and whilst cemetery space is sufficient at present, the 7-9 years capacity will decrease.

4.0 Detailed proposal

- 4.1 Following on from the review of the cemetery service in Watford by the Institute of Cemeteries and Crematoria Management, a 10 year strategy was developed for our cemetery service. Since this was adopted in 2016, a number of improvements have been carried out including additional staff, award of Green Flag, ICCM Gold Standard achieved, and the extension of the cemetery office facility. IT has been improved and records management, but one of the underlying issues is the cemetery at North Watford Cemetery is running out of space with 7-9 years remaining. The Council has been proactive in looking at new cemetery space for the last 12 months, which continues to prove challenging. The main issues are groundwater levels and potential contamination, which rules out many of our open spaces, as well as a number of these have current defined uses (playing fields, recreational space) and a small number are also ex-landfill sites.
- 4.2 With the current Covid-19 pandemic, burial rates as well as cremation rates have doubled and there is a concern that the 7-9 years will decrease, hence a more pressing need to find alternative space. Officers have re-visited the North Watford Cemetery site to look at space here and have identified that current areas which consist of ornamental lawn, bedding, a small ornamental pond could be used to create extra burial space as well as ashes interment. At the same time, we need to look beyond the finite lifespan of North Watford Cemetery and options outside the Borough and look at how we can potentially work with neighbouring authorities in Hertfordshire.
- 4.3 With the above in mind, Southern Green Landscape Architects were successful in winning a tender to look at these spaces and options available based on maximising burial space, potential income generation, a combination of traditional burials, ashes interment, columbaria introductions as well as retaining that sensitive feel for the space, including horticultural enhancements. A budget of £700,000 has been allocated to deliver this aspect of the expansion. In summary the proposals include the following:-
- 273 extra burial plots in the area to the south of the car park and on the green space between the cemetery lodge and depot.
 - 200 ashes interment opportunities in columbaria
 - Ornamental Memorial trees with engraved leaves
 - 3 pet columbaria
 - Improvements to the main entrance of the cemetery with a garden introduced
 - Car Park resurfaced and lined
 - Extra areas that have been identified in the lower part of the cemetery.

This gives us the potential of an extra 3-4 years life-span on top of the 7-9 years, possibly longer and maximises space at North Watford Cemetery. There are

currently no opportunities for columbaria ashes interment at North Watford Cemetery. The detailed drawings for these are attached as Appendices.

The current Muslim section has also been expanded with further clearance behind their existing section, relieving the pressure within this area, giving up to another 100 spaces.

5.0 **Implications**
