

Applications for an Extensions to their Premises Licence

- 1. Extension of recorded music Mon, Thurs, Fri & Sat until 03:30 the following morning
- 2. Extension of their activities to specific days: Exhibition of a film until 0300, Performance of Live music until 0330, Recorded Music until 0330, Performance of Dance until 0330, Late Night Refreshment until 0400, Supply of Alcohol until 0300, Premises open to the public until 0400 on the following specific days: David's Day, St Patrick's Day, St George's Day, St Andrew's Day, 'Halloween, Ohristmas Eve, and all Bank holiday Sunday. From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day. An additional hour to the standard and non standard timings on the day when British Summertime commences.

The problems our residents have is concerned with noise and anti-social behaviour caused by the clientele go to and especially from the Café Quarter. The noise can be simply that having been in a noisy environment the people are talking loudly. Extending the hours for music means that emerging clientele will generate a higher level of noise. The hour of peace allows for a quieter emerging clientele.

One of the problems we foresee in the long list of dates requested for longer hours will reduce our enjoyment of a quieter Sunday night. Again the half hour music gap before closure has the same objection as above.

We wish to register our strong objections to these applications.
