Title: Relocation of Glen Rovers Gaelic Football Club to Radlett Road –

exemption to contract procedures in relation to the pitch works

## 1.0 **SUMMARY**

1.1 The relocation of Glen Rovers GAA Club to Radlett Road has been an ongoing project linked to the WHC initiative. Two growing seasons are required to allow establishment of a new pitch for use in 2016. The relocation of the club is a planning condition of the proposed new link road, commencing in November 2014.

1.2 A Pre Qualification Questionnaire (PQQ) was issued for the pitch works in March 2014 on the councils procurement portal with only 4 submissions. Three subsequent Invitations To Tender (ITT) were issued but only 1 tender was returned which was considerably over the allocated budget.

With the delays in the project due to ongoing planning concerns, there is a need to appoint a high quality contractor with experience in this line of work who can also advise and influence the design – in essence ECI (Early Contractor Involvement) and can input significant value engineering. A contractor needs to be appointed in August to ensure works commence on site no later than September 2014 or a growing season is lost.

- 1.3 Agripower Ltd carried out works at Knutsford Playing Fields on pitch No2 for the Rugby Club on behalf of the RFU / WBC / WRFC successfully and did not see the advert for the initial tender. We wish to appoint them to work with the appointed landscape architect Southern Green Ltd to deliver a Design and Build pitch that is within the agreed budget to the now very tight timescales and ensure that all the agreed planning conditions are met. The timescales for delivery are now critical and as the previous procurement process did not succeed, exemption is being sought therefore to appoint Agripower direct.
- 1.4 The Council's Contract Procedure Rules allow for exemptions to the Procurement Procedures in exceptional circumstances. In view of the above an application for exemption was made to the Managing Director and Head of Corporate Strategy and Client Services and approved on 4 August 2014 seeking approval to award the contract to Agripower Ltd based on their previous competitive work at WRFC at Knutsford Playing Fields and their expertise in this field of work as well as capacity to deliver on time. This approval is therefore being reported to Cabinet.

## 2.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

2.1 That Cabinet notes the Approved Exemption to the Council's Procurement Procedures in relation to the relocation of Glen Rovers Gaelic Football Club to Radlett Road in relation to the pitch works only.
