There is no shortage of premises selling alcohol in this vicinity and it is unnecessary for there to be another one in such a close proximity. With the addition of even more off licence premises in the area it is possible that those premises will compete further with each other and reduce alcohol prices to increase their sales, thus further encouraging street drinkers.

This application also falls outside of the Council Licensing Policy with regards to the premises being within the Market Street sensitive licensing area as defined in their policy (LP4).

In summary, we feel if this were to be granted it would be detrimental to policing in Watford and the community in its entirety.

This therefore raises strong concerns of how this would impact the wider community in terms of increased Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Disorder.

The Constabulary have concerns regarding this application and accordingly on behalf of the Chief Constable I represent against it
